

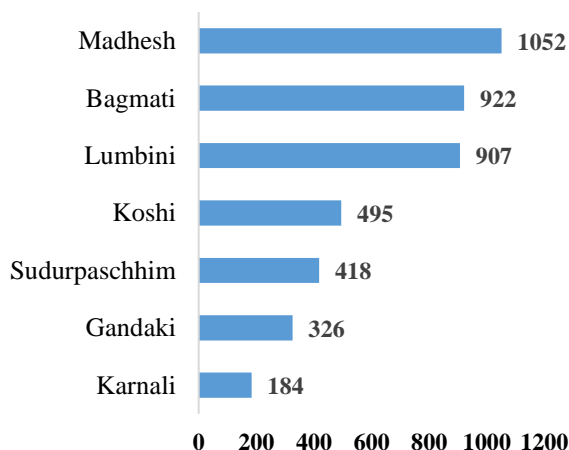
Monthly Bulletin of National Tuberculosis Programme

Jestha, 2081

Highlights

- A total of **4304** Drug-Susceptible (DS) TB and **50** Drug-Resistant (DR) TB cases were reported
- Madhesh Province reported the **highest** number of TB cases in this month
- Total number of deaths were **102**
- Out of 4304 registered cases, **362 (8.4%)** were smokers
- HIV testing was done in **3406 (86.0%)** of registered TB cases
- DST status was known for **1682 (67.0%)** out of **2521** bacteriologically confirmed pulmonary TB cases.

Note: This monthly Bulletin is based on the information reported in DHIS2 through the Health Management Information System (HMIS) from health facilities including a comparison of the last two months. The data was archived on 19 Ashar 2081.

Monthwise comparison of TB cases in Nepal, FY 2080/81

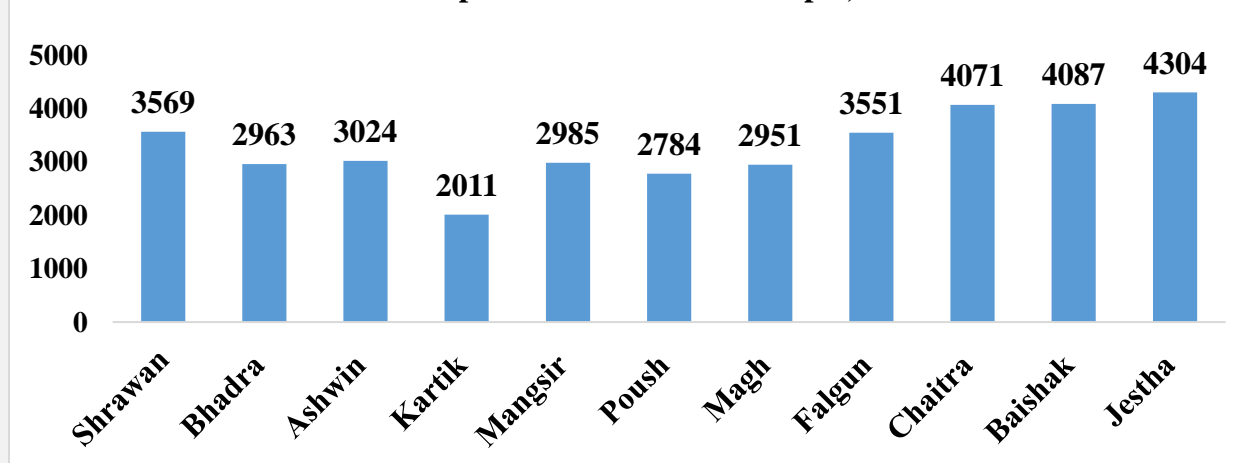


Figure 1: Month wise distribution of registered TB cases

The figure 1 above shows that the highest TB cases were reported in Jestha, 2081 and the least were in Kartik, 2080.

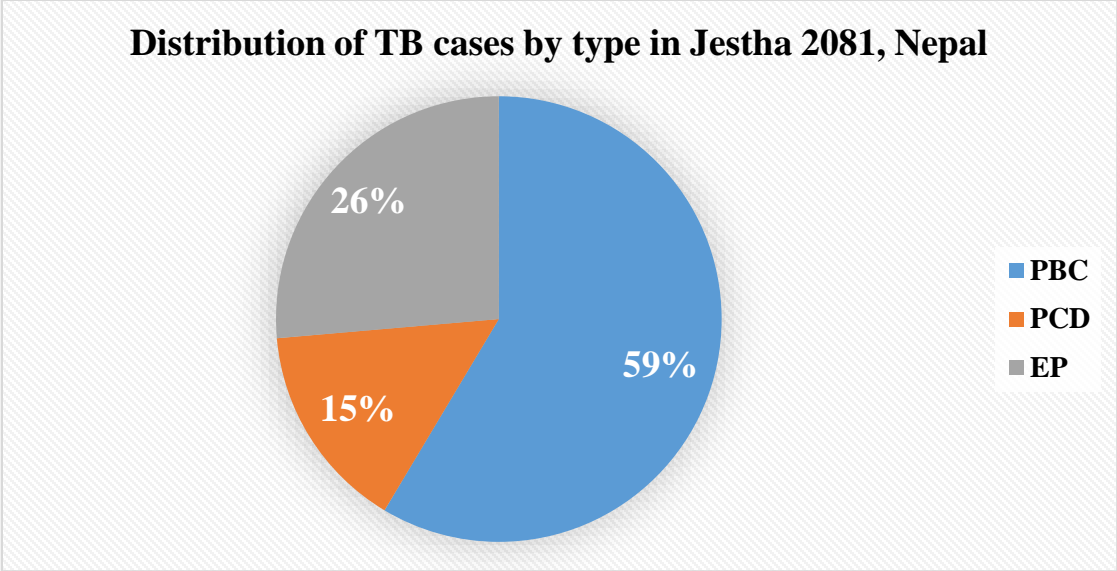


Figure 2: Distribution of TB cases by type of TB (n=4304)

Among the total notified cases, 59.0% were Pulmonary Bacteriologically Confirmed (PBC) cases, 15.0% were Pulmonary Clinically Diagnosed (PCD) and 26.0 % were Extra-Pulmonary (EP) TB (Figure 2).

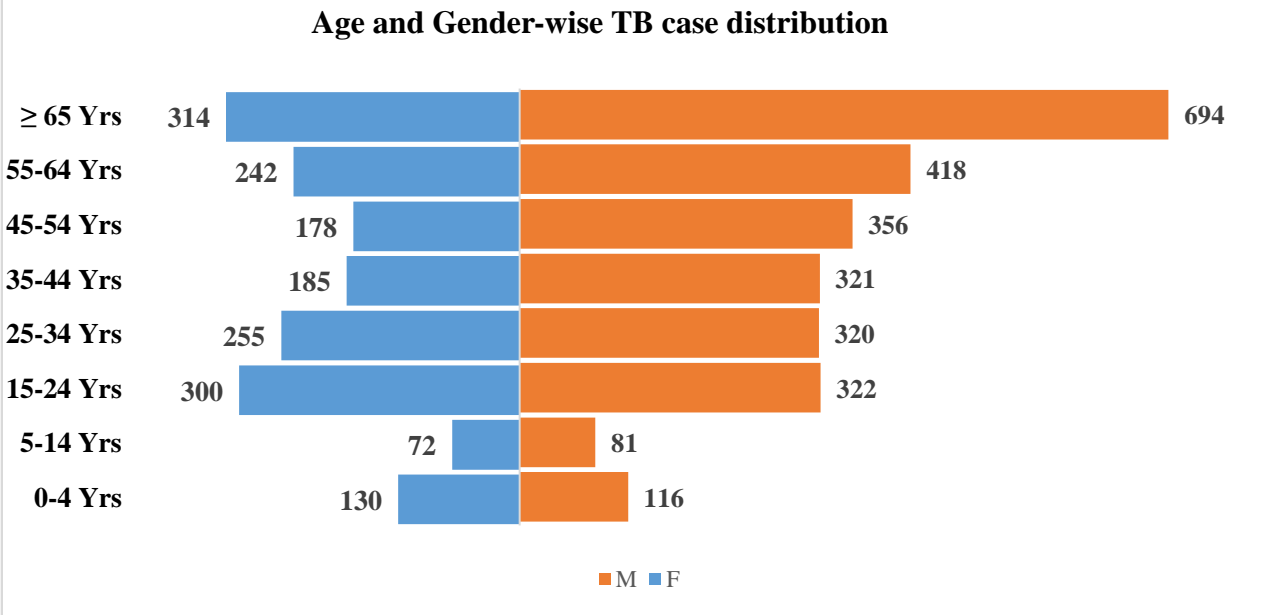


Figure 3: Age and gender-wise notified TB cases

Out of total, two third were male (61.0%) compared to female (39.0%). Regarding the age group, the majority were from 65+ years with 1008 (23.4%) and the least were from the 5-14 years age group with 153 cases (4.6%).

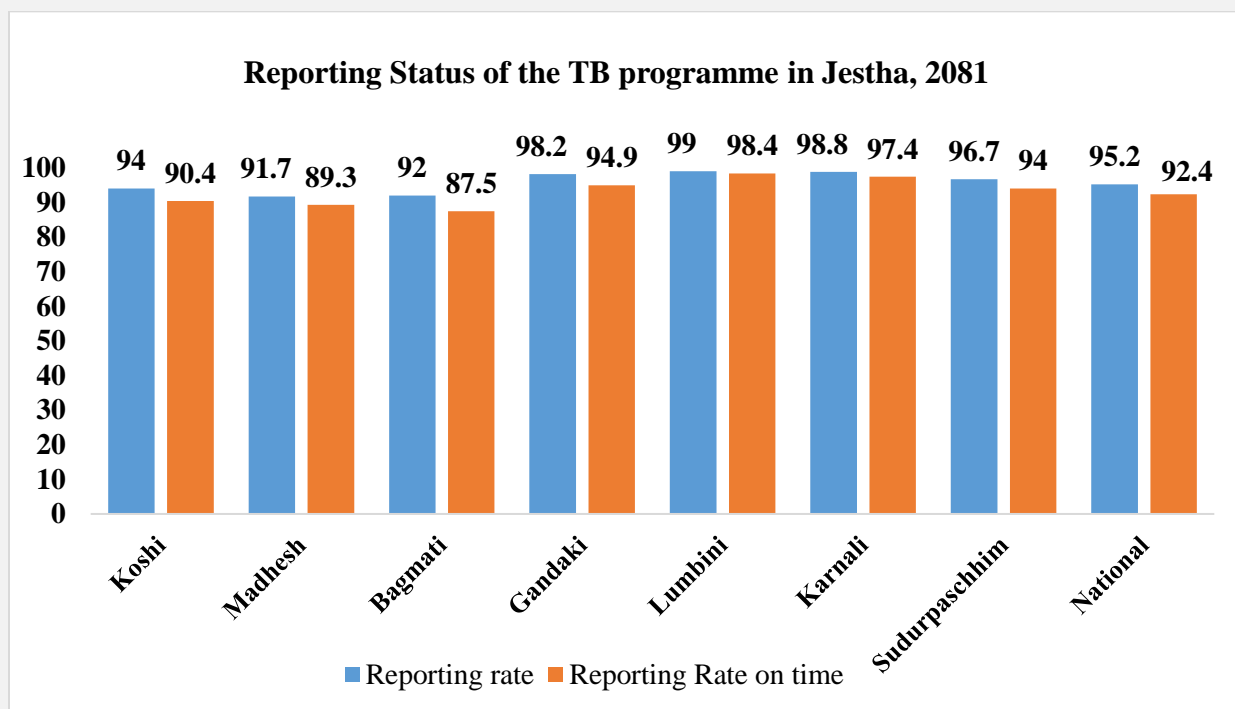


Figure 4: Reporting status of the TB programme:

Highest reporting rate was seen in Lumbini (99.0%) and Karnali Province (98.8%) while the lowest was in Madhesh Province (91.7%). The nationwide reporting status in terms of completeness and timeliness was 95.2% and 92.4% respectively (Figure 4).

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
